Status of paper publications in conferences & Journals with consolidated data for 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18 (till date) and details:

The committee discussed on the status of paper publications in conferences and journals for the past three years. The overall status is found to be in an increasing pattern. The committee also advised faculty to improve the quality of publications published in journals.

7. ANITS publications repository:

The committee informed about the DSpace repository (open source ware) application to facilitate easy retrieval of faculty publications during inspections and reviewing the articles. Librarian is working on this portal and will be available for faculty to upload their publications individually or through department coordinator, when the application is ready.

8. AICTE new curriculum:

The committee informed that there are good chances of implementing the new AICTE curriculum and to be finalized in the coming BoS meeting. In this regard, HoDs are advised to prepare the complete program structure (UG and PG) and first year syllabus with 30% deviations. Uniformity across the courses must be maintained like 5 units in a course, adding Indian authored text books, 6 open electives for a program and total credits to be limited to 160 to suit the local conditions. They are also advised to identify the additional laboratory infrastructure and text books required according to the new curriculum. Prof. M.V Subba Rao is advised to design the induction program for 3 weeks for first year students according to the new curriculum.

9. APSSDC skill excellence centre – ANITS:

It has been informed that ANITS is recognized as Skill Excellence Center by APSSDC. Certified courses can be offered under this umbrella for both in house and outside students at a low cost. As a first step in the process, about 40 laptops were provided which are installed in the e-class room in CSE department which is allotted temporarily. HoDs are requested to go through the courses available in the list and encourage students to enroll for these courses during summer. The HoD has to

nominate one coordinator from each department and Mr Madan, Dean (T & P) will be the SPOC of the programme.
